



NOTICE OF RACE

(First Amendment 6/26/13)

1.0 RULES

- 1.1 The Organizing Authority is Tred Avon Yacht Club in association with Shields Fleet 21.
- 1.2 The Regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing.2013-2016 (RRS) and the Shields Class Sailing Association Rules*.
- 1.3 RRS 63.7will be replaced with: "If there is any conflict between the *Sailing Instructions* and this *Notice of Race*, the *Sailing Instructions* shall apply."
- **1.4** Each boat shall carry a VHF radio capable of receiving and transmitting on Ch 72.

2.0 ADVERTISING

- **2.1** Advertising is restricted by ISAF Regulation 20, Advertising Code, and the *Class Rules*.
- **2.2** Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the Organizing Authority.

3.0 ELIGIBILTY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 The regatta is open to boats and crews of Shields Class yachts who have satisfied the requirements for entry under the provisions of the Shields Class Rule Book (section VI).
- 3.2 Eligible skippers may enter by completing the entry form and other required documentation (Certificate of Compliance, Sail Inventory Registry printout and Regatta Waiver forms) and sending it together with the required fees payable to Tred Avon Yacht Club, P.O. Box 337, Oxford, MD 21654.
- **3.3** Late entries will not be accepted after 0900 EDT Thursday, September 26, 2013. Entries submitted after Thursday, August 15, 2013 should not expect to have local housing available and shall pay a late entry fee of \$75.

4.0 FEES

- **4.1** The entry fee is \$550, which covers:
 - launching and hauling at TAYC
 - dock space or a mooring at TAYC as instructed by the TAYC Shields Nationals Committee upon arrival
 - Social and meals for Skipper and three Crew including:
 - Wednesday and Thursday evening meals with keg beer and soft drinks
 - the award ceremony, dinner and entertainment on Saturday evening
 - continental breakfast on Thursday, Friday and Saturday

NOTE: It is illegal in Talbot County MD to drink alcoholic beverage not purchased under the club's license while on the club premises

4.2 Additional social tickets for the package described cost \$115 per person. (Note: Box lunches for race days, Friday lite fare dinner at TAYC, and wine and mixed drinks will be available on a cash basis.)

6.0 MEASUREMENT

In the spirit of Corinthian racing, the Regatta host is relying on the signed Certificates of Compliance and Sail Inventory Registry printouts as evidence that all participating yachts are compliant with all rules governing participation in the National Championship Regatta.

Measurement checks may be made at TAYC at any time during the regatta and may include: mast step location check, mast and boom band markings, mast partners, hatch seals, spinnaker pole length, mainsheet partners and presence on board of the Shields Class and US Coast Guard required safety equipment including a USCG approved PFD for each crew member. Sail checks may also be made at TAYC at any time during the regatta to confirm compliance with Sail Inventory Card and to check that sails are properly marked on their tacks.





Competitors from Fleet 21 will be subject to the same measurement checks prior to the regatta.

7.0 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instructions will be available at registration and earlier online

8.0 COURSES & SAILING AREAS

- **8.1** Courses will be described in the *Sailing* Instructions and will conform to Section VI-2.4 of the Rules Governing the Running of the National Championship Regatta of the Shields Class Association Rules
- **8.2** Races will be sailed on the Choptank River in the vicinity of the Choptank River Light.

9.0 SCORING

- **9.1.** The Low Point Scoring System of Appendix A (RRS) will apply.
- **9.2.** A maximum of **EIGHT** races are scheduled. Three completed races shall make a series.
- **9.3.** If five or more races are completed, a boat's worst score will be discarded.
- **9.4.** No more than three races will be scheduled on any day.

10.0 SUPPORT BOATS

- **10.1.** Support boats shall display the sail number(s) of the boat(s) she is supporting.
- **10.2.** Competing boats may be towed to the racing area by a support boat.
- **10.3.** Other than outside help defined in RRS 41, no assistance shall be given or gear transferred between support boats and competing boats from the warning signal of the first race until the completion of the final race of each day without prior approval of the Principal Race Officer or Protest Committee Chair.

11.0 HAUL OUT RESTRICTIONS

Boats shall not be hauled out after the start of the first race of the regatta except with the written permission of the Protest Committee.





12.0 DIVING EQUIPMENT AND PLASTIC POOLS

Underwater breathing apparatus and plastic pools or their equivalent shall not be used around boats between the warning signal for the first race and the end of the regatta.

13.0 RADIO COMMUNICATIONS

Except in an emergency, boats shall not have any outside communications while racing that are not available to all boats.

14.0 PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded as follows:

Daily to the first place finisher in each race.

At Saturday's Awards Dinner regatta trophies to Skippers of first five place finishers and other trophies defined in the Shields Class Sailing Association Rules as follows:

- Shields National Champion Trophy to the winner.
- o James B. Moore Trophy to the crew of the winning boat.
- Cornelius Shields Memorial Prize to the most improved competitor.
- Moore trophy for the best performance among the five oldest skippers.
- o Junior Skipper Award for the best performance among the five youngest skippers.
- The Take A Bow award for the most dubious achievement.
- o The Golden Stern Award to the last placed finishing boat that competed
- Kap Dun Fleet Trophy to the best performing fleet with three boats participating
- Gordon I. Benjamin Memorial Newcomer Award to the top finisher sailing in their first Shields National Championship

15.0 CONDUCT & RESPONSIBILITY

- **15.1.** Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The Tred Avon Yacht Club, its Board of Governors, and Shields Fleet 21 will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with, or prior to, during and after the regatta.
- **15.2.** The skipper/owner shall be responsible for all actions of his or her crew or guests. In the event of a breach of conduct, sportsmanship, destruction of property or failure to comply with the request of any Race Officer, TAYC Shields Nationals Committee member or agent of Tred Avon Yacht Club, the skipper/owner will be held responsible and his/her boat shall be subject to protest and disqualification from the Championship.

16.0 VISITING YACHTS

TAYC anticipates having adequate dock or mooring space for all visiting yachts. All support boats may use TAYC facilities on a space available basis after all participating Shields and Committee Boats are accommodated. 17.0 INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third- party liability insurance with a minimum coverage of \$300,000 per event or the equivalent.
