
#### Q1 Which Shields Fleet do you belong to?



### Q2 Have you previously attended a Shields Nationals regatta?





## Q6 Are you in favor of moving race days in future Nationals from Thursday, Friday and Saturday to Friday, Saturday and Sunday?



# Q7 To what extent, if any, do you have concerns about the Saturday dinner being before racing has finished, with prizes given more informally on the Sunday?


