Technical Committee Report given by Ted Slee

Shields National Technical Committee – Accomplishments 2020/21

1. Intervals of inspection – Every two years, mandatory mast step location measurement.

2. Mast section extrusion – voted to be class legal (minutes, Dec 16, 2019)

3. Bow Chock – voted and approved, "The Bow Chock is part of the hull"

4. Used Sails - voted and approved, " Acquired used sails must be remarked and acquisition

recorded in the yacht sail inventory record."

5. Teleconference Meetings – approved for all operational meetings outside of the General

Meeting.

Issues discussed and tabled

1. Mast Taper Manufacture – discussed no with no recommendations

2. Spinnaker pole material – voted to eliminate, "It shall have a minimum diameter of 2

inches and excluding fittings shall be aluminum. Poles with a diameter in excess of 2

inches may be tapered to 2 inches at the ends." Not forwarded to the Governing Board

at this time.

3. Full length top batten in the mainsail and Loose footed mainsail – discussed and

encouraged to be experimental (note local fleets need to obtain permission for the

National Measurer).

4. Spinnaker minimum and maximum limits – discussed and encouraged to be experimental.

5. Rudder restoration/remanufacture – discussed and working on obtaining a loft and

developing a best practice. Hope is to be able to specify a rudder profile in a modern way

to allow the remanufacture of a class legal rudder. Also specify weight limits. 6. Repairs/Restoration of boats – discussed and working on developing a best practice.

7. Requirement that Shields must be wet-sailed.
